



Does your handwriting need some help?



Individualized tutoring available....

- Handwriting instruction and practice with a positive and supportive coach/tutor

Details: First session is 30 mins and includes a preliminary, in-depth handwriting assessment to help create a plan that is customized to each individual's particular handwriting needs.

Typically, six to eight sessions on a weekly basis (with 5 mins. of daily handwriting practice with parent(s) at home between sessions) will help a child's handwriting improve.

COST: \$25 for initial assessment session plus \$16 for print workbook and accompanying parent/teacher guide (\$16 for cursive set if desired)

\$35 for 45 minute sessions that follow initial assessment session
